TOP TIPS

We're thrilled you've decided to fundraise for Global's Make Some Noise. Here are a few top tips to keep in mind when planning your activity.

COLLECTIONS

Organising a collection is a great way to fundraise, but there are a few rules which you'll need to follow.

- Street collections require a permit from the local council or the Metropolitan Police (if you're in Greater London), so you'll need to contact them about this.
- Collections in pubs, shopping centres, supermarkets etc. simply require the permission of the owner or manager.
- House-to-house collections are governed by struct rules which vary from area to area, but your local council will be able to help and advise you on this.

LOTTERIES, RAFFLES & TOMBOLAS

If not, don't panic - just contact us for advice.

Lotteries, raffles and tombolas are also brilliant way to fundraise. They're governed by gaming law, so use this simple checklist to make sure you're doing things properly.

If you're running the lottery/ raffle/ tombola as part of a larger event, such as a school fete or at a sports club fun day:

YOU'RE MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Thanks to your support, this year Global's Make Some Noise has already awarded over £1.4 million in grants to brilliant small charities across the UK.

From Glasgow to Cornwall, these projects are doing amazing work to support youngsters and their families up and down the country.

Young people just like Alecia, who has a complex and rare condition called Ataxia Telangiectasia (A-T). In fact, A-T is so rare that it affects around four in every million children. Sadly, there is currently no cure.

A-T affects those who have it in many different ways, but it often impacts on their coordination and movement, weakens their immune system and ability to fight off infections, and can significantly increase their risk of cancers. It's so complex that no two people will have exactly the same symptoms or experience.

But, thanks to the A-T Society – a small project supported by Global's Make Some Noise – Alecia is not alone.

Their activity weekends give her an opportunity to meet up with other teens living with the same condition, and it's a time when she can really relax. She said: "You don't feel lonely when you are with other people who have A-T, I'm just a normal girl."
