

HOW TO APPLY

Stage 1: Expressing your interest

If you're interested in your charity being part of Global's Make Some Noise, then we want to hear from you!

The first thing you'll need to do is to fill out the Expression of Interest (EOI) form on our website.

We'll ask you to provide basic information about your charity and who you support. We'll also ask you to confirm that you meet our criteria to be a Global's Make Some Noise charity.

This information will be reviewed by the Global's Make Some Noise Grants team who will do some basic research on your charity and invite you to the next stage if you meet our core criteria.


Unfortunately, we're unable to invite all those who submit an Expression of Interest to move onto the next stage.

Stage 2: Completing an application

If you're invited to the next stage, you'll be sent an application form to complete.

Here, you'll be asked to provide in-depth information about your charity's work, detail a project that Global's Make Some Noise will be able to fund (see our funding initiatives download) and tell us more about the children, young people and families you support. This is your chance to show us why your charity deserves to be in the spotlight!

Where possible, we'll give you four weeks to complete your application. We'll confirm the deadline with you when we invite you to the application stage.



Stage 3: The Grants Panel

In February, the Global's Make Some Noise Grants Panel will assess all fully completed applications and choose which charities we'll be supporting through our next campaign.

Usually, we'll select between 30 and 40 charities every year. This helps us to fulfil our three-part promise to the charities we support: raising money, raising awareness and raising the bar.

We'll aim to let all our applicants know if they've been successful by the end of May, however sometimes this may take a little longer.

Sadly, due to the volume of applications we receive, we're unable to support every charity that applies to be part of Global's Make Some Noise.

If you're successful in your application, we'll set you an aspirational funding amount. This amount will be based on what you have applied for and what we feel we can commit to raising for you. It's usually set as funding for one year of your project, or a specific element of your project, such as a role.

We do this because we don't raise the money until after our charities are in place, therefore the amounts are based on our predicted fundraising income for the year.
